

AFRICANA STUDIES INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Africana Studies Program in conjunction with the Arizona Historical Society and the Dunbar Project is offering a paid internship opportunity. The successful student candidate will participate in the Historical Society's Museum Academy Program. This Academy will be used to provide proficiency in five core areas: Collections, Exhibits, Education, Library and Archives and Community Relations. Significant direct training will be provided within each discipline. Upon completion, the intern will work with the Dunbar Project to help develop its museum program. This program will include collecting and preserving artifacts, developing interpretive programs, and building community involvement.

This internship will last for 12 months with the student working 20 hours per week during the school year and 40 hours per week during the summer. It will provide compensation in the amount of \$12,000 per year.

The prerequisites for applicants will be as follows:

- (i) The student should be a senior/junior level minor or major in Africana Studies.
- (ii) The student should have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
- (iii) The student should demonstrate some history of involvement with the African American community.
